
Structural Options



- Within planning areas, draft models were created which grouped some parishes together to foster collaboration. Four canonical approaches exist for parish collaboration:
 - 1. One Parish/One Pastor May occur through extinctive union or merger of multiple parishes into a new parish.
 - 2. Collaborative Each parish maintains distinct canonical identity but has one pastor, one staff, and joint programming.
 - **3. Multi-Parish pastoring** Each parish maintains distinct canonical identity, separate staff, separate programming, but shares clergy.
 - **4. Deacon Administrator** A parish or parishes administered under Canon 517.2 with sacramental care provided neighboring priests and overseen by a priest moderator.
